

Examples of Title IV-E unallowable services – statements in job descriptions

Deliver or provide counseling and therapy to help with a child's adjustment at the institution.

Deliver or provide counseling and therapy to help a child resolve the problem(s) for which he or she was placed.

Deliver or provide counseling and therapy with the child and his or her biological family to resolve the difficulties that led to the need for placement.

Deliver or provide counseling and therapy to plan for the return of the child to the community;

Conduct psychological testing, evaluation, and assessment.

Conduct educational testing, evaluation, and assessment.

Teach the clients; teaching

Providing clinical operations and programming

Oversight of clinical operations and programming

Provision of therapeutic milieu

Coordinate educational services such as school enrollment, discharge, tracking records, participation in IEP and other school meetings, other collaboration with schools as indicated in client treatment plan

Follow direction of Clinical Director

Develop treatment plans for primary counselees

Implementing treatment plans for all the residents

Consult with specialists; prepare and present case reviews to consulting psychiatrist and psychologist

Participation in clinical staff meetings

Instruction

Instructs consumers in relaxation techniques

Instructs consumers in calisthenics, stretching and limbering exercise

Counsels consumers

Trains staff in techniques of relaxation therapy

Plan, develop, direct, evaluate and coordinate educational program

Formulate in-service educational program

Represent the facility as a member of the Pennsylvania Association of Resources for People with Mental Retardation (PAR)

Knowledgeable or capable of learning the professional standards and regulations that pertain to managed care, mental health and drug and alcohol services

Ensures adherence to all federal, state, county and departmental rules and regulations governing ICFMR programs

Assess active treatment issues and make recommendations and requests for needed services and interventions

Member of and teacher for sexuality education classes

Provision of medical services

Diagnosis of medical illnesses

RED Flags – statements in job descriptions that have raised question regarding Title IV-E allowability and could be interpreted as unallowable by ACF

Oversee medication management procedures

Student assistant program

Orders medical supplies

Recreational planning

Performs other duties as assigned

Requirements-one year experience working with persons with emotional disturbances

Provides opportunities for job shadowing

Ability to properly protect the emotional, psychological and physical health, safety and well-being of clients

Implements individual treatment programs

Demonstrates knowledge of behavior expectations

Plans and participates in holiday, education, vocational and leisure activities

To function as an advocate, facilitator and case manager
Member of behavioral management committee
